2023 has begun with more rain and some very cold weather. Steve's commitments have meant his first collecting trip of the year wasn't until the latter half of January. The constant rain has resulted in a couple of fairly large rock and mud slides. Nothing compared to the size of the recent cliff fall at West Bay on January 18th, but still enough to make a difference to the landscape. Sadly the landscape changes in Kimmeridge don't often yield many greats finds, like they often do in West Bay, Lyme Regis or even Charmouth. As usual it's the ledges Steve is more interested in, but they were not fruitful in his most recent visit. However Steve did find a couple of new discoveries including some tiny ophiuroids and a bone (see pictured) which is a mysterious find due to its semi-hollow nature. We believe it may be a turtle bone, but it will not be added to the collection.
